



Eight in ten want action on gas prices



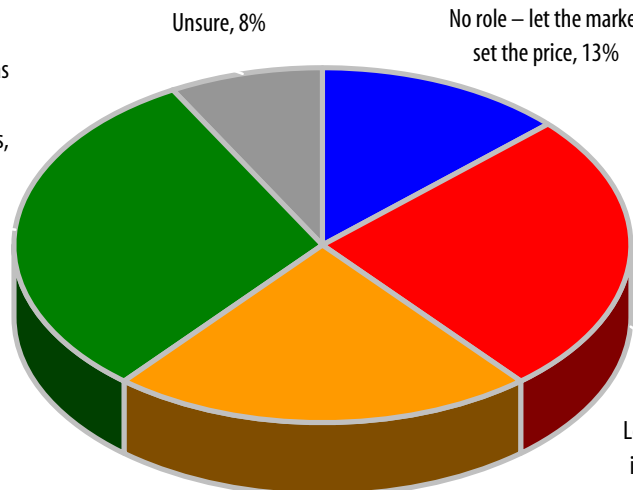
METHODOLOGY

Between September 13th and September 15th, 2008, Nanos Research conducted a random telephone survey of 1,202 Canadians 18 years and older. A random telephone survey of 1,200 Canadians is accurate plus or minus 2.8%, 19 times out of 20. Margins of accuracy are wider for subgroup samples. Readers should note that the data was weighted for gender and age to match the Canadian census results. Results should be considered representative of the Canadian population. Results may not add up to 100% due to rounding.

The research was registered with the Marketing Research and Intelligence Association of which Nanos is a Gold Seal Corporate Member.

QUESTION: Thinking about the retail price of gasoline what role, if any, do you think the federal government should have in bringing down gas prices?

Set up a commission which will monitor gas prices and prevent gouging at the pumps, 31%
