## Nanos looks at two front-runners, followed by undecided

*Displaying start of article containing 758 words* - Seat projections more accurately measure what is happening during election campaigns, says a political polling expert.

"It's the best measure of what's going on. The polls don't tell us anything," said Greg Morrow, a former faculty member at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology who specializes in the intersection of politics and urban space. Mr. Morrow runs the DemocraticSpace.com website which last week projected a Conservative Party minority government and offers predictions for every seat in the country. According to DemocraticSpace.com, the Conservatives would take 144 seats in the House of Commons, based on recent polling data, while the Liberals would have 83, the NDP 31, the Bloc 48, and there would be two Independents if an election had been held last week.

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
